



Teaching English Literacy is the newest of our adult education staff development courses. The course is designed to acquaint adult educators who work in the field of English language acquisition with the knowledge, skills and tools to positively impact the teaching and learning in ESL programs across the state of South Carolina.

South Carolina is part of the growth trend of adult learners enrolled in English as a Second Language classes and adult educators have been forced to quickly accommodate this large new audience of learners. To successfully meet this challenge, a base of well-trained instructors is needed to work with adult English language learners. This professional development curriculum designed specifically to address this significant need. The curriculum presents current research. theory and best practices in ESL instruction. It further provides the opportunity for interactive analysis and application of the guiding principles of the discipline.
